

Arctostaphylos den. 'Howard McMinn'

'Howard McMinn' Manzanita

This shrub is highly appreciated for its decorative characteristics, which include a dense show of small, pale pink urn-shaped flowers in winter and spring. Above all, it is the mahogany-red to brown bark (which peels beautifully) that is the major attraction. Its small, red fruit resembles the tike apple, appearing at the end of winter just as Spring is coming. Evergreen, shiny leaves are very neat and tidy. It can reach 8' tall and 10 wide.


